

## How To: Remove badge letters on rear

I had my 120d de badged when I ordered it, but i've done this before

- 1) Clean the area around the badge thoroughly
- 2) Apply some heat from warm water or hair drier onto the lettering badge. If its not hot enough to burn your hand it certainly shouldn't damage the paint.
- 3) Slide some waxed nylon dental floss under each letter and gradually move it backwards and forwards. Slowly, the floss will make its way through the glue.
- Once removed, you will have a sticky residue. stain devils glue/chewing gum remover works wonderfully and was recommended to me by a professional car detailer. Take care though, only use a small amount and wash off thouroughly after use. It says it removes paint, but don't worry thats for paint which has not been cured as on a car. Just be careful and you should have no problems.
- 5) Once removed and cleaned apply a few coats of good wax to the area.
- 6) Job done
